NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That within one month after the last publication of this Notice, application will be made to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, Chapter 85 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the Company is to be "CHESTNUT CANOE Co., Ltd."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(a) To establish, carry on, operate and conduct in the Province of New Brunswick, or elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada, a general business for the manufacture and sale of canvas canoes and boats and other articles made of canvas and wood, or either, or of any other material other than canvas and wood, whether metal or otherwise, and for the manufacture of machinery, engines, boilers, and any and all electrical or other mechanical appliances, including generators and motor outfits and appliances, as well as any and all kinds of fittings, whether wood or metal, or a combination of wood with any other substance, all as may be necessary in connection with or incidental to the manufacture of such canoes, boats or other articles, or as may be necessary or in any way incidental to any of the purposes of the said Company.

(b) To have, hold, use and enjoy, purchase, acquire or dispose of letters patent of invention, patent rights and privileges, and to work, use, develop and exercise same, and any in which the Company may become interested, whether as owner, licensee or otherwise.
