NOTICES FOR PRIVATE BILLS.

EXTRACTS FROM RULES OF THE SENATE.

"All applications to Parliament for Private Bills of any nature whatsoever, shall be advertised by a Notice published in the *Canada Gazette*; such Notice shall clearly and distinctly state the nature and object of the application, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same; and, when the application is for an Act of Incorporation, the name of the proposed company shall be stated in the Notice.

IN CASES WHERE EXCLUSIVE POWERS ARE ASKED.

"In addition to the Notice in the *Canada Gazette* aforesaid, a similar Notice shall also be published in some leading newspaper, in the principal city, town or village, in each county or district, and in each province or territory which may be affected by the passage of such Private Bills, according to the nature of the undertakings contemplated thereby.

"And, if the works of any company (incorporated or to be incorporated) are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, such intention shall be specifically mentioned in the Notice; and the applicants shall cause a copy of such Notice to be sent by registered letter to the Clerk of each County Council and of each Municipal Corporation which may be specially affected by the construction or operation of such works, and also, to the Secretary of the Province in which such works are, or may be located, so as to reach those officers not less than five weeks before the consideration of the petition by the Committee on Standing Orders; and a statutory declaration establishing the fact of such mailing shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate.

"All such Notices, whether inserted in the *Canada Gazette* or in a newspaper, shall be published at least once a week for a period of five consecutive weeks; and, when published in the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba, shall be in both the English and French languages; and *Marked* copies of each issue of all newspapers containing any such Notice shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate, endorsed "Private Bill Notice;" or a statutory declaration as to due publication may be sent in lieu thereof."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereinafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE DORCHESTER WOODWORKING CO., Ltd."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To carry on in the Town of Dorchester, and elsewhere in the said Province of New Brunswick, a general woodworking business for the purchase, manufacture and sale of lumber of all kinds, doors, sashes, blinds, house and office furnishings and all other articles made of wood.

(b) To acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, lands and buildings for the purposes of said Company, and to erect upon said lands factories and buildings, and to sell and mortgage the said lands and buildings of the Company when so acquired or erected whenever said Company may deem it advisable so to do.

(c) To sell and mortgage all or any portion of the personal property of the Company at any time whenever said Company may deem it necessary for the purposes of said Company.

(d) To carry on, operate, manage and conduct a general business for the manufacturing and repairing of carriages, sleighs and other vehicles and conveyances, and generally to deal in, buy, sell, exchange conveyances, engines, boilers and machinery of every kind.

To establish, operate and conduct a general lumbering business, with power to do all things necessary to supply the mills and factories with lumber of every kind, and manufacture the same in all branches of woodworking.

To buy, acquire, take over, hold, deal in, keep, sell, manufacture and have manufactured all kinds of metals and woods and other products.

To establish and operate a mill with machinery and everything necessary for crushing, milling, grinding, dealing in and handling grain and products of grain of every kind.

To take and enter into contracts for the erection, painting and repairing of buildings, and to do painting and jobbing of every nature and kind.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold and enjoy all the property franchises, rights or privileges held or enjoyed by any other individual or Company carrying on business similar in whole or in part to that which this Company is authorized to carry on, and to pay for such property, rights, privileges or things as are above set out, either in shares of the Company, or partially in shares or otherwise, with full power to lease, sub-let, sell, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the said Company.

And generally to do all things for the purposes hereof.

3. The office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland.
