### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twelfth day of February, A. D. 1907; incorporating James A. Murray, of the Town of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick, Manufacturer's Agent; Edward Connely, of the same place, Merchant; George F. Calkin, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in said Province, Insurance Agent; Thomas B. ### NOTICE OF GRANTING SUPPLEMENTARY LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twelfth day of February, A. D. 1907, whereby the Capital Stock of the "DALHOUSIE LUMBER COMPANY, Limited," has been increased from Three hundred thousand dollars to Five hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, by the creation of two thousand two hundred and fifty shares of the par value of One hundred dollars each. That the present issued shares amounting to Three hundred thousand dollars be constituted Class A or Ordinary Stock, and the new shares amounting to Two hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars be constituted Class B or Preference Stock, the said Class B or Preference Stock to confer the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable half-yearly, and the right in a winding up to repayment of Capital in priority to Class A or Ordinary Stock.
