

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, for a grant or Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act, and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE SWEDISH CANADIAN LUMBER COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, carry on and continue the lumber, milling and shipping business now carried on by "The Rosebank Lumber Company, Limited," an incorporated company having its head office at Nordin, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, and also the real estate and other property in connection therewith or otherwise owned by the said "The Rosebank Lumber Company, Limited."

(b) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, carry on and continue the lumber, milling, planing, woodworking and shipping business, of "The Swedish Planing Company, Limited," an incorporated company having its head office at Nordin aforesaid, and also the real estate and other property in connection therewith or otherwise owned by the said "The Swedish Planing Company, Limited."

(c) To carry on and operate a general lumbering business in all its branches, including log driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every description and kind, and the buying, selling and dealing in lumber of every kind, manufactured and unmanufactured, both wholesale and retail.

(d) To purchase, deal in and sell, at wholesale and retail, all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise, and to carry on a general trading and mercantile business.

(e) To build, purchase, charter, lease or otherwise own, hold and possess in fee simple, or otherwise, mills, stores, factories, warehouses, machine shops, waterways and roads, buildings, plant and machinery, vessels, barges, wharves, booms, dams and other improvements that may be deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes or incident to the business aforesaid, and also to purchase, lease or otherwise own, hold and possess in fee simple, or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses, lumber rights, options and other real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary or incident to the business aforesaid, with power from time to time to encumber the said real and personal property or any part thereof, and from time to time to dispose of any property, real or personal, at pleasure; and to do any and all such other things as may be necessary or incidental to the said business or the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought.

3. The head office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at Nordin aforesaid.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the said Company is to be Seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into two classes of shares or stock, viz:—"A" Stock being ordinary stock of the Company, divided into thirty thousand shares at Ten dollars each, and "B" Stock being Preference Stock and divided into forty-five thousand shares at Ten dollars each.

NOTICES FOR PRIVATE BILLS.

EXTRACTS FROM RULES OF THE SENATE.

"All applications to Parliament for Private Bills of any nature whatsoever, shall be advertised by a Notice published in the *Canada Gazette*; such Notice shall clearly and distinctly state the nature and object of the application, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same; and, when the application is for an Act of Incorporation, the name of the proposed company shall be stated in the Notice.

IN CASES WHERE EXCLUSIVE POWERS ARE ASKED.

"In addition to the Notice in the *Canada Gazette* aforesaid, a similar Notice shall also be published in some leading newspaper, in the principal city, town or village, in each county or district, and in each province or territory which may be affected by the passage of such Private Bills, according to the nature of the undertakings contemplated thereby.

"And, if the works of any company (incorporated or to be incorporated) are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, such intention shall be specifically mentioned in the Notice; and the applicants shall cause a copy of such Notice to be sent by registered letter to the Clerk of each County Council and of each Municipal Corporation which may be specially affected by the construction or operation of such works, and also, to the Secretary of the Province in which such works are, or may be located, so as to reach those officers not less than five weeks be-

fore the consideration of the petition by the Committee on Standing Orders; and a statutory declaration establishing the fact of such mailing shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate.

"All such Notices, whether inserted in the *Canada Gazette* or in a newspaper, shall be published at least once a week for a period of five consecutive weeks; and, when published in the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba, shall be in both the English and French languages; and *Mailed* copies of each issue of all newspapers containing any such Notice shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate, endorsed "Private Bill Notice," or a statutory declaration as to due publication may be sent in lieu thereof."
