

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, in accordance with the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body politic and corporate, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:—

(1) The proposed name of the Company is "THE FRANK WHITE CATERING COMPANY, Limited."

(2) The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought, are:

(a) To acquire and take over as a going concern the undertaking of Frank White, doing business at the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, as a general confectioner and caterer, and all or any of the assets and liabilities including the good-will of said undertaking, and to pay for the same in cash or in paid up shares of the Company, or part one way and part the other, and to continue said undertaking, and generally to carry on the business of restaurant proprietors, confectioners, caterers and amusement providers, including the conducting of restaurants, refreshment booths, tea houses and similar places, catering to private and other parties, buying and selling, at wholesale and retail, candies, fruits, nuts, ice cream, sodas and confections of all kinds, also meats, fish and other groceries, manufactured and unmanufactured; and to provide amusements and entertainments of all kinds, indoor and outdoor.

(b) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, and to hold, own and possess in fee simple, or in any less estate, or by way of grant or license from any province, municipality, corporation or individual, and to employ, use, control and work any lands, buildings or other property, real or personal, and any interests therein, and any easements, franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary, suitable, desirable or convenient for the purposes of its business, also plant, machinery, engines, works, steamers, horses, carriages and such like, and to sell and dispose of all said property, both real and personal, or any part thereof.

(c) To sell and convey, encumber, alienate, lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of all property, both real or personal or mixed, as the business may require or at the pleasure of the Company.

(d) To own, operate and manage carriages, buckboards or other vehicles, steamboats, ferries, houseboats and boats of all kinds for public hire and transportation.

(e) To install, own, operate and manage plant, engines and works for artificial lighting, either by oils, gas, electricity or any other means, and to use and transmit same in and to any and all of the Company's premises or elsewhere, and to sell same to other parties whenever and wherever the Company desires to do so.

(f) To purchase, take by original subscription or otherwise acquire and to own and hold shares of the capital stock and the bonds, debentures or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation or corporations, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

(g) To purchase and acquire the stock-in-trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses and effects and estates of any person or persons or incorporated company now or hereafter carrying on any similar business, or to take security thereon, and when so acquired to continue, sell or dispose of same and any and every part thereof.

(h) To have offices and stores or branch offices and stores wherever the Company shall see fit.

(i) To carry on a general wholesale and retail business in goods, wares and merchandise of every kind and description.

(j) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with any business of the Company or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's rights and property, and to do all and everything incidental, conducive, necessary, desirable, suitable, convenient or proper to and for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive to or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as holder of or interested in any property or otherwise, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, and as well without as within the Province of New Brunswick.

(3) The head office of the Company is to be in the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

(4) The Capital Stock of the proposed Company is Forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety shares of the par value of (One hundred dollars each, of which Thirty-two thousand dollars is actually subscribed.

### CONTRACT FOR DRIVING.

TENDERS for a Contract for three years for driving the logs, timber and lumber put into the Tobique River from the several points below mentioned out into the River Saint John, at the rates below stated, will be received by the Tobique River Log Driving Company, at Woodstock, until noon of the second day of APRIL, and at the QUEEN HOTEL in Fredericton until noon the third day of APRIL next.

The tender to state the amount that will be paid by the tenderer annually for the contract.

The contract to contain such clauses and conditions as the Directors may prescribe to secure the faithful and satisfactory performance of the work. The rates to be paid per thousand superficial feet of timber, logs and lumber driven out into the River Saint John, will be as follows:—

- 1st. From the Forks of the Tobique River,.... 40 cents.
- 2nd. From Two Brooks..... 30 cents.
- 3rd. From Gulquae and Burnt Land Brook,.... 25 cents.
- 4th. From Wapskehegan,..... 20 cents.
- 5th. From Points below,..... 10 cents.

The Directors are not obliged to accept the highest or any tender unless the same shall be satisfactory to them, as to the ability of the party tendering to carry out the contract, the price offered, and all terms and conditions of the tender.

The tenderer must name two bondsmen who are ready to enter into a Bond with him for the sum of Four Thousand Dollars for the due performance of the contract, and the written consent from such persons to enter into the bond must accompany the tender.

In case the driving of the logs, timber and lumber be not contracted for upon tender, the same will be sold at Public Auction in front of the York County Court House, on WEDNESDAY the third day of APRIL next, at 4 o'clock, p. m., pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Assembly.
