(d) To carry on and conduct a general lumber business, including the cutting, driving and manufacturing, buying, selling, importing, exporting, shipping, preparing for market and marketing and otherwise trading and dealing in and with logs and lumber, manufactured and unmanufactured, and all products of lumber and wood, and all articles and commodities in the manufacture of which lumber or wood is used.

(e) To purchase, hire, take in exchange, or by war of license or lease, or by way of assignment or security, and otherwise acquire, employ, use, own, hold, control, work and operate lands, water privileges, lumber and timber limits, leases, Crown Land lumber or timber licenses, or other lumber or timber licenses, mills, machinery, plant, wharves, booms, steamers, vessels, tugs, scows, boats and other craft, and other real and personal property, and any interest therein, and any easements. franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary, suitable, desirable or convenient for the purposes of its business.
