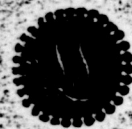
PROCLAMATION.

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the ninth day of January, A. D. 1908, incorporating Francis Kerr, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law; G. Herbert Green, of the same place, Engraver; Wellington Kimball Herrington, of the same place, Railroadman; Alice Kerr, of the same place, Spinster; and J. King Kelley, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:—

For the purposes of purchasing, acquiring and taking over, as a going concern, the business and undertaking, plant, machinery and good will of the fuel business at present carried on by Francis Kerr, in the City of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, with the wharves, real estate, personal property, machinery, effects and other assets of the said Francis Kerr, in, about or in any manner connected with the business conducted by him under the name and style of The Saint John Fuel Company.

And also, for the buying and selling and dealing in all kinds of wood, coals and fuel; and also for carrying on the business of wharfingers and all matters incidental thereto and the doing and carrying on of all business and transactions of every kind incident or belonging or appertaining to any of the objects or purposes aforesaid which could be conveniently carried on in connection thereto.

Also, to build, erect and conduct a lumber and saw mill for the purpose of sawing wood and manufacturing lumber of all kinds, and to buy, sell and deal in lumber and timber of every description, and to erect and maintain mills, wharves and yards.

And also, to amalgamate with or purchase and procure conveyances of and operate any other mills, manufactories, foundries, machine shops, electric light and electric power companies and other mechanical operations and the merchandise, capital stock, stock in trade, or good-will thereof, or of any bodies corporate, having, holding or owning the same.

And also, to apply for, purchase, or otherwise acquire and to hold, own, use, operate and to sell, assign or otherwise dispose of, to grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent of Canada or any other country.
