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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the granting of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter named:—

1. The name of the Company is to be "NEW BRUNSWICK IRON MINES COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, are:

(a) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real and personal estate, mines, mining rights, leases and lands, in the Province of New Brunswick, and any interest therein, and to explore, work, develop, and turn to account or to sell or lease the same.

(b) To prospect and explore in all parts of New Brunswick for minerals of every sort and description whatsoever, with the view to locating and acquiring mines and mining rights, and working and operating the same, and to quarry, smelt, refine, dress, manufacture and prepare for market ore, metals, pigments and mineral substances of all kinds, and to carry on any other operations which may seem conducive to any of the Company's objects.

(c) To buy, sell, manufacture and deal in minerals, plant, machinery, implements, conveniences, appliances and things capable of being used in connection with mining operations, or required by workmen and others employed by the Company.

(d) To construct, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend any roads, tramways, bridges, reservoirs, water streams, water courses, and the rights to dam the same aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, mills, crushing works, hydraulic works, factories, warehouses, and other works and conveniences which may seem conducive and advantageous to any of the objects of the Company.

(e) To acquire and hold stock in any companies engaged in any of the businesses or undertakings above mentioned.

(f) To produce and accumulate electricity, electric motive force or other agency similar, or otherwise, and apply the same for the production, transmission or use of the power for lighting, heating or motive purposes.

(g) To purchase or otherwise acquire any business within the objects of the Company, and any lands, privileges, rights, products and liabilities appertaining to the same.
