NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of April, A. D., 1908, incorporating Henry C. Read, of the Town of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Stone Manufacturer; Gordon Read, of the same place, Stone Manufacturer; Herbert W. Read, of the same place, Civil Engineer; Maud Read of the same place, wife of Henry C. Read; and Ellen L. Read, of the same place, Spinster; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over and carry on the business now carried on by "Joseph Read & Co." at Stonehaven in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick; the business now carried on and engaged in by Henry C. Read, at Woodpoint and Rockport in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, and which said business consists principally in quarrying, manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in grindstones and other implements and tools made of stone, stone for building and other construction work and purposes, the contracting for and the construction and erection of buildings and other construction work in whole or in part of stone, the doing of a general store and mercantile business and such other business as is incidental to any of the aforesaid lines of business.
