

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC** Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Thirteenth day of May, A. D., 1908, incorporating James Robinson, of Millerton, in the County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; John Ferguson, of Newcastle, in the County aforesaid, Merchant; Frederick M. Tweedie, of Chatham, in the said County, Gentleman; William E. Fish, of Newcastle aforesaid, Crown Land Surveyor; and Richard A. Lawlor, of Chatham aforesaid, Barrister-at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real and personal estate, mines, mining rights, leases and lands in the Province of New Brunswick, and any interest therein, and to explore, work, develop and turn to account or to sell or lease the same.

To prospect and explore in all parts of New Brunswick for minerals of every sort and description whatsoever, with the view to locating and acquiring mines and mining rights, and working and operating the same, and to quarry, smelt, refine, dress, manufacture and prepare for market, ores, metals, pigments and mineral substances of all kinds, and to carry on any other operations which may seem necessary and conducive to any of the Company's objects.

D., 1908, incorporating John Harry King, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, Life Insurance Agent; Harry Leigh Beaman, of Digby, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Specialty Company Manager; Samuel Herbert Flewelling, of the Parish of Hampton, in the County of Kings, in the Province of New Brunswick, Manufacturer; Robert Guilford Flewelling, of the said Parish of Hampton, Manufacturer; and William Edward King, of said City of Saint John, Foreman of Brush Factory; for the following purposes, namely:

D., 1908, incorporating Fred C. Palmer, of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; W. Hazen Chapman, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; Clinton Cook, of Parrsboro, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Master Mariner; Herbert G. Palmer, of Dorchester aforesaid, Clerk; and C. Lionel Hanington, of Dorchester aforesaid, Barrister-at-law, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire certain stone rights and privileges, situate, lying and being in the County of Westmorland, and elsewhere throughout the Province of New Brunswick, and elsewhere, and to develop, work, operate, manage and control quarries for the production, taking, manufacturing and dressing of building stone, ax-stone, pulp-stone, and all other products capable of being made or manufactured of stone, or stone and any other substance combined, and to sell or otherwise dispose of said products.
