BRIDGE NOTICE.

SEALED Tenders marked "Tender for Fredericton Bridge Superstructure," will be received at the Department of Public Works, Fredericton, until Monday, 20th day of July, 1908, at noon, for constructing three metal superstructure spans of the Fredericton Highway Bridge, between the City and the South end of the already revised work. One span consisting of a trough pin connected structure of 260 ft. from C to C of end pins; one span consisting of a through riveted swing draw of 144 ft. from face to face of arm rest piers; one span consisting of a deck riveted girder of 108 ft. from face to face of adjacent substructure walls, according to plans and specifications to be seen at the Public Works Department, Fredericton, N.
