NOTICE OF SALE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that there will be sold at Public Auction, in front of the Court House, Bathurst, New Brunswick, on Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of October next at twelve o'clock noon, by virtue of the power and authority vested in the undersigned Mary Ann O'Brien, by a decretal order of the Supreme Court in Equity made on the first day of June last past in the matter of John M. O'Brien, a lunatic, confined in the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, all of the one sixth undivided share and interest of said lunatic, John M. O'Brien of, in, to, out of and upon the lands and premises particularly mentioned and described in said decretal order as follows:
