

NOTICE OF SALE.

Crown Land Office, Fredericton, N. B., 19th Aug. 1908.
THE right to cut logs and timber on the following described blocks of Land, situate in the Blue Bell Tract, so called, in the County of Victoria, for the year ending 31st July, 1909, will be offered for sale at Public Auction, at the Crown Land Office, in the City of Fredericton on Tuesday, the 9th day of September next at 12 o'clock noon, subject to conditions imposed and the rates of stumpage heretofore prevailing.

The following is a description of the several blocks or lots of land, viz:

Block A.—Being all that portion of the Blue Bell Tract lying between the north eastern line of Range 1 in Deputy Hanson's survey for settlement, in the year 1907, and the south west line of lands owned by the New Brunswick Railway Company, bounded north westerly by the north eastern prolongation of the north west line of lot No. 26 in Range 1, aforesaid, and south easterly by the north eastern prolongation of the south eastern line of lot No. 43, in Range 1 aforesaid, containing 3 1-2 square miles, more or less, at the head of Little Salmon River.

Block B.—Adjoining south easterly Block A aforesaid bounded on the north east by the south west line of lands owned by the N. B. Railway Company, south easterly by western line of Sisson Ridge Sett. and south westerly by the north eastern line of Range 1, in Deputy Hanson's survey aforesaid and its south eastern prolongation to the Sisson Ridge Sett. Containing 3 1-2 sq. miles, more or less, being on Three Brooks in the vicinity of Cameron and Fall Brooks.

Block C.—Being all that portion of the Blue Bell Tract bounded south westerly by the Anderson Road, so called, running from New Denmark Sett. to Arthurette north easterly by the south west line of Range 2 in Deputy Hanson's survey for settlement of the year 1907 and the southwest line of Block B aforesaid easterly by the west line of Sisson Ridge Settlement and the west lines of granted and surveyed lots fronting on the west side of Tobique River, north westerly by the south east line of lot No. 326, granted to A. P. Jensen in New Denmark Sett. and the south eastern lines of lots Nos. 25 and 50 in Ranges 1 and 2 of Deputy Hanson's survey aforesaid. Block D.—Being all that part of the Blue Bell Tract bounded on the north east by the Anderson Road south west by the north eastern lines of Tilley Settlement, north west by the south eastern line of a 600 acre block, formerly owned by the N. B. Railway Company, as surveyed by W. T. Whitehead, in the year 1875 and adjoining north easterly of Ranges 5 and 6 of the said Tilley Settlement and the prolongation of the said south eastern line of said block to the Anderson Road aforesaid, south easterly by the rear or north west lines of granted and surveyed lots in the 1st and 2nd Tiers north westerly of Tobique River. Containing 30 sq. miles, more or less, and distinguished as Block D. on Bear Brook a branch of Three Brooks and the heads of Pokiok River.

Block E.—Being all that portion of Blue Bell Tract bounded as follows:—on the north east by the Anderson road, north west by the south eastern lines of lots in New Denmark Settlement and the New Denmark Settlement south south westerly by the north eastern lines of a 600 acre lot formerly owned by the N. B. Railway Company as aforesaid described and the north eastern line of Tilley Settlement south easterly by Block D. aforesaid. Containing 8 sq. miles, more or less, being at the head of the Right Hand Branch of Little River and south west of Blue Bell Mountain.
