We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint and We do appoint Monday, the ninth day of November next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favored this year; and We do invite all our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Trusty and Well-beloved Councillor The Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honourable Sir Albert Henry George, Earl Grey, Viscount Howick, Baron Grey of Howick, in the County of Northumberland, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, and a Baronet; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order, etc., etc., Governor General and Commander in chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this TWENTY-SIXTH day of SEPTEMBER, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eight, and in the eighth year of Our Reign.
