

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given, that the persons herein-after named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act" incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

That the proposed corporate name of the company is "The Nepisiguit Fishing Club."

That the objects for which the proposed incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over, in exchange for the Stock of the Company, all the lands and premises, fishing rights and privileges, and all other riparian rights now owned by the Nepisiguit Angling Association, and also the lands and premises, fishing rights, privileges, and all other riparian rights now owned by the applicants, situate upon and adjacent to the Nepisiguit River in the Parish of Bathurst in the County of Gloucester, in the Province of New Brunswick.

(b) To hold, use, exercise and enjoy all riparian fishing rights in the Nepisiguit River which the proposed Company will be entitled to as owner of the said lands and premises so proposed to be purchased, acquired and taken over, and also all riparian fishing rights upon any and all other lands which the company may hereafter acquire, or leasehold or other interests which the proposed Company may hereafter acquire in the fisheries of said river.

(c) To develop, use and enjoy all water powers upon the Nepisiguit river which the Company may be entitled to as riparian proprietors, and for that purpose to build, erect and maintain all dams, sluices, water ways, water wheels, artificial channels and water courses, and all gearing, machinery, equipment and appliances necessary for the full and complete development of any and all such water powers, and to sell mechanical power.

(d) To generate electricity for the purpose of heating, power, and lighting, and to sell or lease the same, and to use and dispose of the same in any manner whatsoever for profit or for their own purposes, and for that purpose to convey the same by wire or other devices to the consumers thereof.

(e) To lease, for profit, any and all water powers or other riparian rights held by the proposed company, and any lands and premises necessary therefor.

(f) To buy, acquire and hold, bonds, stocks and securities of other companies.

(g) To buy, sell, acquire, mortgage, lease, deal in and convey lands and premises of every description, and all rights, members, privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging and easements appertaining thereto.

That the chief place of business of the Company is to be established at the Town of Bathurst in the County of Gloucester, in the Province of New Brunswick.

That the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is Sixty thousand dollars, divided into One hundred and twenty shares of the value of Five hundred dollars each.

That the applicants ask for the embodying in the Letters Patent of a provision, that the shares of the Capital Stock of the Club shall not be transferable to any person not then being a member of, and shareholder of the Club, until the name of the proposed transferee or member has been first submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members and approved in such manner as may be prescribed by the by-laws of the Club when incorporated.
