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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the grant of a charter of incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, Chapter 85 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

(1) The proposed name of the Company is to be "MIRAMICHI FISH COMPANY, Limited."

(2) The objects and purposes for which such corporation is sought are:

(a) To operate, manage, conduct and carry on a general fishery business in the said Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere in the Dominion of Canada.

(c) To fish for, net, catch, take, trap, cure, can, preserve, buy, barter, exchange, sell and otherwise deal in Salmon, Bass, Trout, Codfish, Ling, Hake, Herring, Smelt, Frost fish, Flounders, Lobsters, Oysters, Clams, and other fish, Crustacea and Bivalves, and to carry on and conduct a general merchandise business in connection therewith.

(d) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange, or otherwise, and to hold, own and possess in fee simple or in any less estate, or by way of grant or license from any Dominion, Province, Municipality, Corporation or individual, and to employ, use, control and work, any lands, buildings or other property, real or personal, and any interests therein, and any easements, franchises, licenses, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary, suitable, desirable or convenient for the purposes of its businesses; also plant, machinery, engines, horses, wagons and other vehicles, boats, canoes, nets, traps, and other fishing gear and appliances, and to sell, lease, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of all said property, both real and personal, or any part thereof, from time to time.

(e) To manufacture or purchase tin cans, cases, boxes, barrels and other receptacles made of tin, iron, wood or any other material or materials combined, and for the purposes aforesaid to purchase and deal in same and every material necessary for the purposes herein named, whether manufactured or unmanufactured.

(3) The head office of said Company is to be in the Town of Chatham in the County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick.

(4) The capital stock of the said Company is to be Ninety-nine thousand dollars, divided into nine hundred and ninety shares of One hundred dollars each, of which five hundred and ten shares are actually subscribed for.
