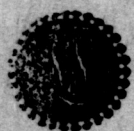

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the sixth day of June, A. D. 1906, incorporating William S. Montgomery, of Dalhousie, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, Trader; John Harris, of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, Province aforesaid, Merchant; Weldon Robinson, of Derby, in the County of Northumberland, in said Province, Gentleman; Richard O'Leary, of Richibucto, in the County of Kent, in said Province, Merchant; and Richard A. Lawlor, of Chatham, in the County of Northumberland aforesaid, Barrister; for the following purposes, namely:—

To carry on a general mercantile and trading business.

To acquire, construct, maintain operate and dispose of all factories, cold storage houses, buildings, machinery, vessels, apparatus and appliances incident and necessary for the conduct of the said business as the Company may deem advisable for the purposes of its undertaking; by the name of "THE FOOD SUPPLY COMPANY, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of One hundred thousand dollars, divided into one hundred shares of One thousand dollars each.
