## NOTICES FOR PRIVATE BILLS.

## EXTRACTS FROM RULES OF THE SENATE.

"All applications to Parliament for Private Bills of any nature whatsoever, shall be advertised by a Notice published in the *Canada Gazette*; such Notice shall clearly and distinctly state the nature and object of the application, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same; and, when the application is for an Act of Incorporation, the name of the proposed company shall be stated in the Notice.

"In addition to the Notice in the *Canada Gazette* aforesaid, a similar Notice shall also be published in some leading newspaper, in the principal city, town or village, in each county or district, and in each province or territory which may be affected by the passage of such Private Bills, according to the nature of the undertakings contemplated thereby.

"And, if the works of any company (incorporated or to be incorporated) are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, such intention shall be specifically mentioned in the Notice; and the applicants shall cause a copy of such Notice to be sent by registered letter to the Clerk of each County Council and of each Municipal Corporation which may be specially affected by the construction or operation of such works, and also, to the Secretary of the Province in which such works are, or may be located, so as to reach those officers not less than five weeks before the consideration of the petition by the Committee on Standing Orders; and a statutory declaration establishing the fact of such mailing shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate.

"All such Notices, whether inserted in the *Canada Gazette* or in a newspaper, shall be published at least once a week for a period of five consecutive weeks; and, when published in the Provinces of Quebec and Manitoba, shall be in both the English and French languages; and *Marked* copies of each issue of all newspapers containing any such Notice shall be sent to the Clerk of the Senate, endorsed "Private Bill Notice;" or a statutory declaration as to due publication may be sent in lieu thereof."

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act" incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereinafter become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "SMITH COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To carry on a general manufacturing and mercantile business within the Province of New Brunswick, and elsewhere, embracing the manufacture, purchase and sale, by wholesale and retail, of lumber of all kinds, whether manufactured or not, brick, lime, coal, machinery of all kinds, machinist tools and supplies, dry goods, groceries, farm produce, grains, cereals, flour, feed and all other articles of merchandise capable of manufacture, barter and sale; and for any and all of the said purposes to purchase, acquire, erect, equip and maintain, lease and sell mills, factories and tramways of all kinds, and operate same for any and all of the above purposes, and also to engage in the business of cutting, hauling, driving, booming and rafting of timber, logs and lumber of all kinds, and all other things necessary in the carrying on of a general lumbering business.

(b) To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses and lumber lands, timber limits, lumber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, milling businesses, waterways and rights, buildings, plant, machinery, vessels, tugs, scows, booms, dams, driving rights and franchise and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incidental to the business aforesaid, or any part of it; and upon any lands so acquired by the Company to erect houses and buildings and sell or lease the same.

(c) To establish, operate, conduct and carry on a general blacksmith, horse shoeing and farrier business.

3. The office or chief place of business of said Company is to be at East Florenceville, in the Parish of Peel, in the County of Carleton, in the said Province of New Brunswick.

4. The capital stock of the said Company is to be Fifteen thousand dollars, divided into fifteen hundred shares of Ten dollars each. The amount of capital stock actually subscribed is Eight thousand and Ten dollars.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, the Company hereinafter mentioned, will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Supplementary Letters Patent, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Letters Patent Act.

The purposes and objects for which the grant of the said Letters Patent is sought are as follows:—

1. To authorize the increase of the capital stock of the Company from Six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000), divided into twelve thousand (12,000) shares of Fifty dollars (\$50) each, to Two Millions of dollars (\$2,000,000), divided into two hundred thousand (200,000) shares of Ten dollars (\$10) each.

2. To authorize the Board of Directors of the Company to pass a Bye-Law to fix the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, in this Province, as the chief place of business of the Company, and from time to time to change the same and to fix such other place for the Head Office as the Board of Directors may determine.

3. To authorize the Directors from time to time to elect from amongst their number a President, and if they see fit one or more Vice-Presidents, and besides such other officers as they may conclude to decide upon.

4. To authorize the Directors out of their own number to select four Directors, who, with the President, shall be and constitute an Executive Committee having the powers of the Board of Directors in managing the Company's affairs, except so far as such powers may be expressly limited by a Bye-law of the Company from time to time at a meeting duly called upon notice for such purpose.

5. To obtain the repeal of Sections Five and Six of the Act of Assembly 51 Victoria, Chapter 78, incorporating the Company, and to procure the repeal also of Clause Seven of the said Act of Assembly, substituting for such Clause Seven sub-Section C of Section 31 of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Letters Patent Act.

6. To obtain a grant of the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the purchase by the undersigned New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, of the telephone system lines, wires, poles, franchises, assets and property of all description of the Central Telephone Company, Limited, and the like approval of the purchase or acquisition by the undersigned of the like property, assets and franchises of the several Companies, acquired by the Central Telephone Company, Limited, and now forming parts of the Central Telephone Company, Limited's system; and for the like approval of the purchase by the undersigned Company of the Madawaska Telephone Company's franchises, property and telephone lines; and the property and telephone system of the Chatham Electric Company and Miramichi Company's exchange in the Newcastle district, assigned to Ferdinand L. Pedolin by Indenture dated the second day of December, A. D. 1889, and by the said Ferdinand L. Pedolin assigned and transferred to the undersigned Company by two other Indentures dated respectively the eighth and thirteenth days of March, A. D. 1906.

7. For a grant of approval to the New Brunswick Telephone Company, Limited, of the purchase of the property, rights, franchises and assets of the Central Telephone Company, Limited, by the undersigned Company, and for the confirmation and ratification of a Memorandum of Agreement dated the twenty-first day of August, A. D. 1906, between certain Directors of the two respective Companies upon the conditions, terms and covenants contained in the said contract, and for authority to give effect to, authorize and sanction the several purposes and objects in the said contract mentioned and hereinbefore specified.
