NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of incorporation, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, pursuant to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE S. H. WHITE COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To acquire and take over as going concerns the business, assets, property and good-will of the following persons, firms and companies, that is to say: of the S. H. (d) To carry on a general mercantile and trading business, and from time to time, at pleasure, to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, lease, sell, mortgage, encumber, alienate, grant and convey real estate, chattels real, easements, licenses, franchises, options, patent and patent rights, and without limitation by reason of the foregoing particulars, personal property of any and all kinds.

(e) To acquire, construct, maintain, operate and dispose of all mills, shops, buildings, vessels, machinery, apparatus and appliances which the Company may deem necessary or desirable for the purposes of its business.

3. The chief place of business of the proposed Company is to be in the Town of Sussex in this Province.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That within one month after the last publication of this notice in the ROYAL GAZETTE, application will be made by the parties hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council for a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and Acts in amendment thereof, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body politic and corporate under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE GRAND MANAN TELEPHONE COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(a) To establish, maintain, operate, conduct and carry on a general telephone business in all its branches, including the building of offices, the setting, erecting and constructing of poles and posts, stringing or putting up of wires, making of connections, buying and selling of telephone instruments, wire and all other fittings, appliances and apparatus necessarily used and employed in carrying on a telephone business, and generally to do all and everything necessary to make, complete, support, use, work and maintain a system of telephonic communication between North Head, in the Parish of Grand Manan, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick, and Castalia, Woodward's Cove, Grand Harbor, Seal Cove, Southern Head and White Head Island, all in the Parish of Grand Manan, in the County of Charlotte aforesaid, and between such other points or portions of the said Parish of Grand Manan, as the said Company may hereafter deem necessary or expedient or in its interests so to connect by telephone.

(b) To make connection with the cable or submarine wire of any company, corporation, individual, or the Canadian Government, which now is or at any time hereafter may be laid or constructed, connecting or to connect the Island of Grand Manan with any of the smaller islands adjacent thereto and forming a portion of the Parish of Grand Manan, or with any portion of the main land, and with whom the said Company may hereafter be able to enter into satisfactory terms or arrangements for the pur-

pose of establishing, securing and maintaining telephonic communication between some portion of the Island of Grand Manan and the smaller islands adjacent thereto, and forming a portion of the Parish of Grand Manan, or with the main land, or with any outside point not located or being in the said Parish of Grand Manan, such cable or submarine connection to be made at or from such point on the said Island or Parish of Grand Manan as the said Company shall deem most suitable, convenient and expeditious for its purposes, and as the said Company may hereafter determine upon.

(c) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, own or hold such lands, grants, licenses, rights, privileges, buildings, plant and such other real and personal property, and such leases, licenses, options, franchises, rights and claims of, in, to and upon the same as may be required or deemed necessary for the purpose of or incident to the business aforesaid, and to do all other things necessary for the accomplishment of the objects for which incorporation is sought.

(d) To purchase, erect and maintain, or to acquire by grant, purchase or lease what may have been already erected, the necessary posts, poles, wires and other works along the public streets, roads squares, open plots of ground or highways between the above named places or in the territory above described, and for that purpose to have full power and authority given to the said Company, its successors or assigns, its agents, servants and workmen to enter upon the side or sides of all or of any of the public roads, bridges, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways within the said Parish of Grand Manan, and upon the same to set up, erect and construct such and so many posts, poles, or other works as the said Company in its discretion may deem necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, working and maintaining a system of communication by telephone between the said places or within the said territory: to stretch wires thereon, and from time to time as often as it may be deemed necessary, to break open any part whatsoever of the said roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways, not however to interfere with that part of the same appropriated for the use of carriages, waggons or horses, and to keep the same open during the time necessary for the setting up, erecting, constructing, maintaining and repairing or replacing of such posts, poles or other works used in connection with the operations of the said Company.

3. The chief place of business of the Company is to be at Grand Harbor, in the Parish of Grand Manan, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick.
