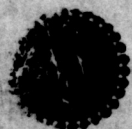

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, pursuant to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereinafter become shareholders in the proposed Company; a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the said Company is to be \$45,000, divided into 4,500 shares of \$10.00 each.
