PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the thirty-first day of August, A. D. 1906, incorporating William Amies of the Parish of Perth, in the County of Victoria and Province of New Brunswick, Miller; Samuel J. Brown, of the same place, Millman; James W. ## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the thirty-first day of August, A. D. 1906, incorporating Robert Meighen, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Capitalist; John Turnbull, of the same place, Capitalist; Joseph Hardisty, of the same place, Accountant; Major Frank Meighen, of the same place, Gentleman; W. Turney Whitehead, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, Land Agent of the New Brunswick Railway; and Hugh H. McLean, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire real and personal estate, and, grants, licenses, leases, fishing, shooting and sporting privileges and any and all interests therein.
