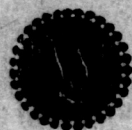

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the fourth day of July, A. D. 1906, incorporating William Michael Dowd, of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick, Moulder; Herbert Roy Hicks, of the same place, Moulder; Angus McDonald, of Antigonish, in the Province of Nova Scotia, Moulder; Alexander Chisholm, of Watertown, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Moulder; Alphe Richard, of Dorchester, in the said County of Westmorland, Moulder; and Nelson Hicks, of Moncton aforesaid, Moulder; for the following purposes, namely:—

To establish, carry on, operate, manufacture and conduct a general business for the manufacture of machinery, engines, boilers, agricultural, electrical and other machinery and appliances, and engines of every description, stoves and furnaces, gas generators, and to deal in all such machinery, appliances and engines, and any and all kinds of iron, steel, brass and metal goods whether as metal only or in

combination with wood or any other substance, and to carry on a general iron, brass and other foundry business in all its branches.

To have, hold, use and enjoy, purchase, acquire or dispose of Letters Patent of invention, patent rights and privileges, and to work, use, develop and exercise the same and any in which the Company may become interested, whether as owner, licensee or otherwise.

To enter into contracts for the erection, fitting up and completing or repairing of all kinds of mills, factories, steamboats, or other water crafts of every kind and description, and to purchase, acquire, erect, build, work, carry on and operate foundries, mills and factories of all kinds.

To manufacture, import, sell, exchange and otherwise deal in stoves, furnaces, machinery, farm utensils, brass fittings, castings and metals of every nature and kind, and to manufacture the same into machinery or other articles into which the same may be manufactured, and in combination with wood to manufacture vehicles, conveyances, farming machinery and utensils, cars, trucks, sleds and other similar articles.

To establish, build, found, erect and maintain one or more foundries at Dorchester, or elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, and all machinery necessary therein.

To buy, acquire, take over, hold, deal in, keep, sell, manufacture, or have manufactured, all kinds of metals and woods and their products, and build material of every nature, kind and description, including milling supplies, and all articles and things of practical utility in the conducting of the Company's business, and to deal in, handle, supply, sell, make and contract for supplies for plumbing and do a general plumbing business.

To buy, sell, hold and deal in all kinds of lumber and woods, manufactured and unmanufactured, paints and varnishes, and to enter into contracts for the erection, painting or repairing of buildings.

For the purposes aforesaid, to purchase, lease, acquire, have and hold real and personal estate of all kinds.

To acquire by original subscription, or otherwise, and to purchase, hold, sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of or hypothecate the shares, stocks, bonds, debentures or other obligations of any other Company authorized to carry on any business or undertaking within their powers, and to take, acquire, have and hold or give security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever, and to purchase or otherwise acquire, hold or dispose of real or personal property.
