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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.
