

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the sixth day of December, A. D. 1906, incorporating William Amies, Miller; Samuel J. Brown, Millman; James W. McPhail, Merchant; Charles L. Olmstead, Tailor; and George E. Armstrong, Guide; all of the Parish of Perth, in the County of Victoria and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:—

To carry on the business of electricians, manufacturers, workers and dealers in electricity, motive power, heat and light, and to manufacture and produce, and either as principals or agents, trade and deal in any article belonging to such business, and all apparatus, appliances and things used in connection therewith, and to supply the same for production, transmission or use of power for lighting, heating and motive purposes, and to light streets, places and buildings, public or private, by means of electricity; to construct, maintain and operate works for the supply and distribution of electricity for light, heat and power; to enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground and highways in the Villages of Andover and Perth, in the said County of Victoria, and the vicinity thereof, and break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground and highways, or any part thereof, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and posts and stringing and maintaining wires for electric light, heat and power purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same, and for placing and maintaining under ground along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, street mains, pipes or conduits for the conveying of electricity for light, heat and power purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same, and to do all other things necessary to carry on such business.

Provided, however, that the construction of said works and the necessary appliances in connection therewith shall be under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Municipal Council for the County of Victoria, or any officer or person appointed for the purpose, and, provided also, that before said Company shall break up and open any part of the said streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways and interfere with the parts thereof appropriated for the use of carriages, wagons and other conveyances, the Company shall give previous notice of its intention so to do, in writing, to the Superintendent of Highways of the Highway Division in which it is proposed to break up and open any part of said streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, and shall receive his consent thereto, in writing; and provided also, that the said Company shall and do at its own proper cost and charges, and to the satisfaction of the said Municipal Council, or any officer or person appointed for the purpose, and of the said Superintendent of Highways, and without any unnecessary delay, repair and amend the said streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as aforesaid to the condition in which they were before breaking up or opening the same. No poles or wires shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires of any telephone or electric light or telegraph company now existing, or so as to injure or impair the efficient working of any telephone, telegraph or electric light system in places where any such system may be in operation before the Company hereby incorporated establishes its system; it being understood, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the Company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles and stringing wires or laying the same under ground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles or wires of any existing telephone, telegraph or electric light system; provided also, that the said Company, its agents and workmen shall not, in the execution of any powers hereby given, do or permit any unnecessary damage, nor shall they cut down or injure any fruit, shade or ornamental tree, nor in any way obstruct the entrance to any door or gateway, nor place any post or other obstruction opposite any window of any store, dwelling house or place of worship, or opposite the entrance to any premises; by the name of "THE PERTH ELECTRIC COMPANY, Limited;" with a total Capital Stock of Nine thousand dollars, divided into three hundred and sixty shares of Twenty-five dollars each.
