

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

Subject to the provisions of the said Act, to acquire by original subscription, purchase, or otherwise, and to hold, own, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or encumber shares, stocks, debentures, bonds or other obligations of any other incorporated company or body corporate or corporation authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations, with power while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon.
