### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of March, A. D. 1906, incorporating George H. Secord, Postmaster; James H. Manchester, Farmer; Herbert S. Jones, Accountant; S. Freeze McCreedy, Breeder; Fred Morison, Station Agent; Arthur B. Gamestar, Tailor; George B. Jones, Merchant; William A. Jones, Merchant; and Walter Manchester, Veterinary Surgeon; all of Apohaqui, in the Parish of Sussex, in the County of King's and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:—

Of having transferred to them, the said The Apohaqui Fishing Club, Limited, the properties described and set out in the Petition of the said Company for the issue of these Letters Patent, now on file in the Office of the Provincial Secretary, and obtaining by purchase or otherwise certain lands and premises situate, lying and being in the County of King's and Province aforesaid, upon which there are lying and being certain lakes and rivers, and of acquiring the rights, privileges and easements of fishing, hunting, shooting and boating on said lakes and rivers, and of erecting and maintaining and keeping, upon said lands and premises, certain club houses, boat houses, stables and other buildings, to be used by the members of the said Club for the purposes aforesaid; by the name of "THE APOHAQUI FISHING CLUB, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of One thousand dollars, divided into ten shares of One hundred dollars each.
