NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the fifteenth day of May, A. D. 1906, incorporating Ralph E. White, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Frances Villa White, of the same place Married Woman; Judson P. Mosher, of the same place, Mill Owner; Walter H. Trueman, of the same place, Clerk; and Albert O. White, of the Parish of Saint Martins, in the City and County of Saint John, Mill Owner; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, carry on and continue the business of wholesale and retail groceries, meats, fruits and provisions, at present carried on in the City of Saint John by Ralph E. White, of the said City, together with the stock in-trade, goods, chattels, merchandise, property, assets and effects belonging thereto, and also the good-will of the said business, and to carry on and continue the said business and to pay for the same in paid up stock of the Company. The present outstanding debts and liabilities of the said business of the said Ralph E. White, and of the said Ralph E. White in connection therewith, are to be assumed and paid by said Company, and the assets of the said business of the said Ralph E. White transferred to said Company are to remain subject to said debts and liabilities, and the said Company may be sued for the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

To conduct and carry on a general mercantile, trading and manufacturing business, and to buy, sell and deal in all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise.

To acquire the good-will of any business within the objects of the Company, and any lands, tenements and hereditaments, privileges, contracts, rights and powers appertaining to the same, and in connection with any such purchase or acquisition to assume the liabilities of any company, association, partnership or person.

The said Company shall have power to issue the shares of the Company at a discount as fully paid up shares and at such discount upon the par value thereof, or at such price or prices as may be determined upon by a majority of the votes of shareholders represented at a meeting of the Company duly called for the purpose, and such power may be exercised in respect of the first or any subsequent issue or issues of the shares of the Company, but so as such power shall not be in reduction of any power for the purpose possessed by the Company by virtue of the provisions of the mentioned Act; provided, however, that if it is determined as aforesaid such shares shall be issued at a discount, notice thereof duly made in writing shall be filed in the office of the Provincial Secretary at or before the issue of such shares, and the provisions in said Letters Patent in respect of said power shall be in lieu of any bye-laws for the purpose that might have been made by said Company under the said Act; by the name of "THE R. E. WHITE COMPANY, Limited;" with a total Capital Stock of Nine thousand nine hundred and fifty dollars, divided into nine hundred and ninety-five shares of Ten dollars each.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the sixteenth day of May, A. D. 1906; incorporating Jesse Green, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, and Province of New Brunswick, Millman; J. William Smalley, of Upper Peel, in the County of Carleton, Province aforesaid, Farmer; Demore W. Ross, of Florenceville, in the said County of Carleton, Physician; Charles J. Smalley, of Stickney, in the said County of Carleton, Carpenter; John N. Perry, of Connell, in the said County of Carleton, Agent; and Weldon W. Melville, of Florenceville aforesaid, Millman; for the following purposes, namely:—

To carry on a general manufacturing and mercantile business within the Province of New Brunswick, embracing the manufacture, purchase and sale, by wholesale and retail, of lumber of all kinds, whether manufactured or not, brick, lime, coal, machinery of all kinds, machinists' tools and supplies, dry goods, groceries, farm produce, grains, cereals, flours, feed and all other articles of merchandise capable of manufacture, barter and sale; and for any and all of the said purposes to purchase, acquire, erect, equip and maintain, lease and sell mills, factories and tramways of all kinds, and operate same for any and all of the above purposes; and also to engage in the business of cutting, hauling, driving, booming and rafting of timber, logs and lumber of all kinds, and all other things necessary in the carrying on of a general lumbering business.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, lands, grants, licenses and lumber lands, timber limits, lumber rights, options, mills, mill privileges, milling businesses, water-ways and rights, buildings, plant, machinery, vessels, tugs, scows, booms, dams, driving rights and franchises, and such other real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incidental to the business aforesaid, or any part of it.

To generate, buy, use and sell electricity for all of the purposes of the company.

To erect, lease, sell and take contracts for the construction of houses and buildings.

To carry on a general manufacturing and mercantile business within the Province of New Brunswick, and to use and sell water for domestic or power purposes.
