NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Act in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the said company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "SCHOFIELD PAPER COMPANY, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:—

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, hold and own the paper, pulp and commission business now carried on by Herbert B. Schofield and E. Allan Schofield, under the name and style of Schofield Bros., Wholesale Paper Dealers at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, together with all the goods, chattels, assets, personal property and effects, rights and credits owned by them in connection with said business, or so much and such part thereof and upon such terms as may be agreed upon with the said Herbert B. Schofield and E. Allan Schofield, and to carry on and conduct at the City of Saint John, and elsewhere, the business of buying, selling, and dealing in all kinds of pulp, paper, paper goods, stationery, printers' supplies, woodenware and general merchandise, and all goods and materials usually dealt in in connection with such business, and to act as agents for others in connection therewith, and generally to perform, conduct and carry on all business of every kind, in connection with the purchase, manufacture and sale of all kinds of pulp, paper, paper goods, stationery, printers' supplies, woodenware and general merchandise and all business incidental thereto, both on commission and otherwise.

(b) Also to carry on a general manufacturing trade and mercantile business with respect to such articles and merchandise as to the said Company shall be deemed expedient for the purposes of its business.

(c) Also to purchase and acquire stock-in-trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses, effects and assets of any person or persons or any incorporated company now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business similar to the business hereinbefore mentioned, and to take security thereon, and to continue the same when so acquired, or to sell and dispose of the same when so acquired, and every part thereof when over to the said Company it shall be deemed expedient so to do.

(d) Also for the purposes of its said business, to purchase, acquire, lease, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, and to sell and dispose of and to convey said real and personal property or any part thereof.
