PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Alexander J. LeBlanc, Esquire, Town Clerk and Treasurer, of the Town of Dalhousie, in the County of Restigouche, has reported to the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that a vote of the ratepayers of the said Town was taken on the seventeenth day of July instant, under and by virtue of a resolution passed by the Town Council of the said Town of Dalhousie, under and by virtue of the powers given by Chapter Sixty-four of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, 6 Edward the Seventh, upon the question of issuing debentures under section two of the said Act, to the amount of fifty-seven thousand dollars, for the purposes therein specified, and that the result of the said voting was that ninety-six votes were cast for the acceptance of the said resolution and seventy-six votes were cast for the rejection thereof.

And it appearing to me by the said report of the said Town Clerk and Treasurer of said Town, that a majority of the said votes so cast as aforesaid were cast in the affirmative;

I DO HEREBY PROCLAIM AND DECLARE the result of the said voting to be the acceptance of the said resolution of the Town Council of the said Town of Dalhousie, authorizing the issue of debentures to the amount of fifty-seven thousand dollars for the purposes mentioned and set forth in section two of said Chapter Sixty-four of the Acts 6 Edward the Seventh.
