NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of incorporation, by Letters Patent, under the "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is to be "SCOVIL BROS., Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To purchase and acquire the mercantile and manufacturing business heretofore carried on in the City of Saint John, and elsewhere throughout the Dominion of Canada, by William G. Scovil and James M.
