UNDER and by virtue of the provisions of that Act of the Legislative Assembly, 9 Edward VII., intituled "An Act

to amend the Liquor License Act, Chapter 22, Consolidated Statutes, 1903," and of an Order-in-Council duly passed on this thirtieth day of April, A. D., 1909, I do hereby proclaim and declare for the reasons set forth therein, that no Liquor Licenses, either wholesale or retail shall be granted in Dukes, Lorne and Victoria Wards in the City of Saint John, or in either of them, on or after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten, of which all persons will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
