SEALED Tenders marked "Tender for Fredericton Highway Bridge Superstructure" will be received at the Department of Public Works, Fredericton, until Monday, 5th day of April, 1909, at noon, for constructing four Metal Superstructure Spans of the Fredericton Highway Bridge at the north end of the already revised work.
