NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at its next Session for the passing of an Act to amend "The New Brunswick Medical Act," Chapter 73 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, by changing the name of the Medical Council to "The College of Physicians and Surgeons of New Brunswick," and providing that all members of the same shall be elected by the New Brunswick Medical Society; by changing the time for publishing the "Medical Register" and providing that the same may be published in any paper, periodical or pamphlet approved of by the College; by providing that a payment of Twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall entitle one otherwise qualified to perpetual registration under said Act; by striking out the words "physic, surgery and midwifery" where they appear in said Act and substituting the words "medical science" therefor; by changing the provisions in regard to examinations and qualifications for registration and making other changes relative to the said Act; and by repealing Sections 15 and 43 and other Sections of said Act.
