IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, constituting the hereinafter named applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created, a body corporate and politic for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the said Company is "J. D. Dickinson & Sons, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:—

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over all the real estate, personal property and business now carried on at the Town of Woodstock in the County of Carleton by the firm of J. D. Dickinson & Sons.

(b) To establish and carry on a general manufacturing and wholesale and retail business in all kinds of leather and leather goods and in articles made from leather, and to buy, sell and make up hides and leather, skins and wool in all forms and processes, and to carry on such business in all lines of goods used in connection with the manufacture and sale of hides, skins, leather goods and wool, and to act as commission merchants, brokers, agents, or in any other capacity for hire for any person or persons, firms or corporations carrying on business with the like objects.

(e) To borrow money upon the credit of the said Company and to mortgage or pledge the real or personal property of the said Company for the purposes of securing the repayment of any such loan.
