All Timber, Logs or other Lumber cut upon Unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own Berth shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any Berth applied for until it shall be purchased at Public Auction.

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given that the following Order was passed in Council on the 3rd March, 1909:—

"Ordered that all purchases of Crown Lands, under the Act to facilitate the settlement of Crown Lands, made prior to the 31st day of October, 1907, and not yet granted, will be cancelled on the First day of June next and the lands again become vacant, unless the parties interested had previously furnished the Office of Crown Lands with the certificate of the Labor Act Commissioner that the conditions of payment, by work or money, improvements and residence, as required by the 3rd Section of the said Act have been fully complied with."
