**JUBILEE OF DISTRICT NURSING, 1859-1909.**

The High Commissioner for the Dominion of Canada  
The Right Honourable Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal,  
My Lord,—

In reference to the letter addressed to you on the 30th October, I am now directed to inform you that the Congress has been definitely fixed to take place in Liverpool during the first half of May, 1909.

The Congress has for its object the commemoration of the Jubilee of the founding of District Nursing by the late Dr. William Rathbone. This great work was started in Liverpool by Mr. Rathbone in the year 1859 and the jubilee of the event is thought to present a suitable opportunity to review its development in this country and other lands. It is also hoped that a Congress of this kind may be fruitful in suggesting fresh means to develop the usefulness of the work in the City of its founder as well as to stimulate emulation elsewhere.

Invitations to send delegates to the Congress will be sent to all kindred nursing associations, etc., in Great Britain, also to the Colonies and to foreign Countries, wherever interest in the work exists. It is the hope of the Committee that you will be so good as to make known this invitation to all who are interested in charitable nursing in the Colony you represent and to transmit to such as may come within its scope a cordial invitation to be present.

The meetings will extend over three days during which a series of papers will be read, and in these and in the subsequent discussions, it is expected to obtain the co-operation of the leading authorities in the medical profession, as well as those chiefly conversant with nursing. It is hardly necessary to say the presence of like authorities from the Colonies will be of much importance, though it is primarily desired to secure the attendance from abroad of those interested specially in nursing.

Her Majesty, Queen Alexandra has graciously signified her Royal Patronage to the Congress. The hope is also indulged that Her Majesty or a member of the Royal Family, will attend the opening meeting and the proper steps will in due course be taken to this end.

The Lord Mayor of Liverpool is President of the Congress Committee, and the Lord Bishop of Liverpool with many other distinguished persons have extended to the project their hearty support.

An intimation of the precise date of the Congress will be sent to you as soon as it is fixed.
