Canada. } WHEREAS it hath pleased Almighty God, in His Great Goodness to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings,—

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint Monday, the twenty-fifth day of October next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and all other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Right Trusty and Well Beloved Councillor, The Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of Canada, and Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honourable Sir Albert Henry George, Earl Grey, Viscount Howick, Baron Grey of Howick, in the County of Northumberland, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, and a Baronet; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of Our Royal Victorian Order, etc., etc., Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.
