

NOTICE is hereby given, that the parties hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1903," and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "The People's Stove and Plumbing Company, Limited."

2. The objects and purposes for which the incorporation is sought are:—

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over, continue and carry on the retail, stove, tinware and plumbing business at present carried on by Frederick E. Law at No. 221 Union Street, in the City of Saint John in the Province of New Brunswick, and the connections, stock, assets, leases, personal property, rights and credits of said Frederick E. Law in connection with said business, and to pay for the same wholly or partly in paid-up stock of the Company to be incorporated, and to assume all and any of the obligations of said business.

(b) To establish and carry on a general wholesale and retail business in stoves, tinware, graniteware, ironware, galvanized iron and copper, and in all lines of goods usually carried on in connection with the stove and tinware business and incidental thereto, and to establish and carry on a general plumbing, gas fitting, steam and hot water heating business with all lines of goods incidental thereto.

(c) To manufacture, buy, sell, and otherwise dispose of and deal in by wholesale and retail all kinds of metal and wood goods and supplies, and to manufacture, import, buy, sell and otherwise dispose of and deal in all goods and materials and supplies usually associated or connected with the stove, tinware, plumbing and heating business, or the manufacture aforesaid, and to act as commission merchant, broker, agent or in any other capacity for hire for any person or persons, firms or corporations carrying on business with like objects.

(d) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with the business of the Company or calculated directly or indirectly, to further the Company's business or enhance the value or render valuable any of the Company's properties or rights.

(e) To purchase and acquire such real and personal property as may from time to time be deemed necessary for all or any of the purposes of or incident to the business aforesaid or any part of the same with power from time to time to encumber the same or any part thereof and from time to time to dispose of any property, both real and personal, at pleasure.

(f) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainments of the objects for which incorporation is sought as aforesaid.

3. The office or principal place of business of said Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of Capital Stock of the said company is to be Twenty thousand dollars, (\$20,000), divided into four hundred shares of Fifty dollars each.
