

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Tenth day of August, A. D., 1909, incorporating Albert E. Wry, of the Town of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, Manufacturer; Aubrey C. Smith, of the same place, Accountant; Henry C. Read, of the same place, Manufacturer; Aretus Anderson, of the Parish of Sackville in said County, Farmer; Charles N. Black, of the Parish of Westmorland, in said County, Farmer; and W. Bedford Dixon, of the aforesaid Town of Sackville, Manufacturer; for the following purposes, namely:

To manufacture all kinds of harness, boots and shoes and other leather goods and to buy, purchase, deal in, sell and dispose of any and all material necessary to the manufacture of said harness, boots and shoes and other leather goods.

To purchase, lease, hold and sell, mortgage, hypothecate and otherwise dispose of real and personal property incidental to the carrying on of said business.

To use, develop and produce steam, water, electricity or other power, force or energy capable of being developed as a motive power or otherwise.
