(c) To purchase or otherwise acquire, take over, own, hold, conduct, carry on and continue the business of any other person, firm or corporation of like or similar lines to the business or businesses above mentioned, or any of them, or of any other capable of being advantageously carried on, therewith, with the stock in trade, real and personal property, plant, effects and assets thereof, and the good will of such business and to pay therefor either wholly or partly in paid up shares in the Company or otherwise.

(d) Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and any rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its said business.
