

IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made by the persons hereinafter named under the said Act to the Lieutenant Governor in Council for a Grant by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick of a charter constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed name of the Company is "George Eddy Company, Limited."

The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:—

To purchase, acquire and take over the mills, mill buildings, lumber, machinery, plant, stores and business at present managed and controlled by George Eddy and Theobald M. Burns, hereinafter named under the name, style and firm of George Eddy Company and the good will of the same and also to purchase, acquire and take over the plant, outfit and business, including good will of any other person or company which may be within the objects of the proposed company and any lands, tenements, hereditaments, privileges, contracts, rights and powers appertaining to the same and in connection with any such purchase or acquisition to assume the liabilities of any company, partnership or person.

To establish, operate, manage and conduct a general lumbering business with power to do all things necessary to supply their mills and factories with logs and lumber and to manufacture the same in all branches of wood manufacture trading but without limitation by reason of express mention deals, shingles, laths, sashes, doors and furniture and also all manner of agricultural implements.

To erect and build houses, buildings and erections of all descriptions whether of brick, stone or wood and to contract for the same.

To establish, operate, manage and conduct a Foundry and Machine Shop for the manufacture of all kinds of machinery and iron work and also a general store and mercantile business both wholesale and retail with power to do business as general merchants and traders.

To purchase, acquire and hold lands in fee simple or otherwise including licenses and leases of Crown Lands with power to sell, mortgage, lease and dispose of the same.

To purchase, hire, construct or manufacture for use in connection with the business of the company any ships, barges, tug boats, rolling stock, machinery or plant.

To construct, purchase and maintain any plant, building, works, factories, mills and other undertakings for the purposes of the Company or connected therewith or necessary or expedient for any of the purposes of the Company or incidental thereto.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer and dispose of personal property of all kinds, including logs, deals, shingles, furniture, agricultural implements, machinery, patents, trade marks and all manner of wood and iron manufacture and to lease, mortgage, sell, transfer and dispose of and otherwise deal with the whole or any part of the property (real or personal) powers, privileges and franchises of the Company to any other Company or person and to accept as consideration therefor any shares, stock debentures or securities of any other Company and generally to do all things necessary or expedient for carrying out the objects of the said Company or any of them or incidental thereto subject however to the laws of the Province of New Brunswick.

To generate, use, buy, sell, accumulate, store, transmit, furnish and distribute electric current for light, heat or power and to manufacture, buy, sell, operate, lease and let electric light fixtures, supplies and appurtenances used in connection therewith.

To operate any of the works of the Company by water, steam, electricity, compressed air, or any other motive power and generally to use water, steam, electricity, compressed air or any other agency as a motive power or otherwise.

To establish and maintain booms, piers, wharves and boom pieces necessary to the protection and shipment of the logs, lumber and manufactures of the Company, provided always the same do not in any wise interfere with the navigation of any stream or river.

The applicants will in their application for Letters Patent ask that there be embodied in the Letters Patent for the incorporation of the proposed Company provisions authorizing and empowering the Board of Directors to borrow money upon the credit of the Company and to issue bonds or debentures and to sell, pledge or hypothecate the same for any sums borrowed or deposit the same as collateral security for any promissory note, cheque or overdraft of the Company at such prices or for such amounts as may be deemed expedient or necessary but no such debentures or bonds shall be for a less sum than One hundred dollars; also to hypothecate or pledge the real or personal property of the Company to secure any sums borrowed by the Company and to secure any bonds or debentures of the Company by the said real or personal property or both, provided always that the amount to be borrowed or for which such bonds or debentures may be pledged or hypothecated shall not at any time be greater than seventy-five per cent. of the actual paid up stock of the Company, provided further, however, that the limitations and restrictions on the borrowing powers of the Company to be contained in such provisions shall not apply to or include money borrowed by the Company on Bills of Exchange, or Promissory Notes made, accepted, or indorsed by the Company or by over-draft or otherwise than on the bonds or debentures of the Company.

The place in which the office or chief place of business of the Company is to be established is Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester, in the Province of New Brunswick.

The amount of the Capital Stock of the proposed Company is Twenty-four thousand dollars to be divided into two hundred and forty shares of One hundred dollars each.

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Second day of March, A. D., 1909, incorporating Walter Hunnewell, of Wellesley, in the State of Massachusetts, in the United States of America, Gentleman; Edward R. Wharton, of Lenox, in the State aforesaid, Gentleman; John Forsyth Grant, of Cheltenham, in the County of Gloucester, England, Captain in the English Army; George West Jones, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Cotton Manufacturer; and R. Keltie Jones, of the City of Saint John, aforesaid, Brewer, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over, in exchange for the Stock of the Company, all of the lands and premises, fishing rights and privileges, and all riparian rights now owned by the Nepisiguit Angling Association, and also the lands and premises, fishing rights, privileges and all other riparian rights now owned by the applicants, situate upon and adjacent to the Nepisiguit River, in the Parish of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester, in the Province of New Brunswick.

To hold, use, exercise and enjoy all riparian fishing rights in the Nepisiguit River which the proposed Company will be entitled to as owner of said lands and premises so proposed to be purchased, acquired and taken over, and also all riparian rights upon any and all other lands which the Company may hereafter acquire, or leasehold or other interests which the proposed Company may hereafter acquire in the fisheries of said river.

Subject to such conditions and regulations as the Lieutenant Governor in Council may hereafter impose, to develop, use and enjoy all water powers upon the Nepisiguit River which the Company may be entitled to as riparian proprietors and for that purpose to build, erect and maintain all dams, sluices, water ways, water wheels, artificial channels and water courses, and all gearing, machinery, equipment and appliances necessary for the full and complete development of any and all such water powers, and to sell mechanical power.

Subject to such conditions and regulations as the Lieutenant Governor in Council may hereafter impose, to generate electricity for the purposes of heating, power and lighting, and to sell or lease the same, and to use and dispose of the same in any manner whatsoever for profit for their own purposes, and for that purpose to convey the same by wire or other devices to the consumers thereof.

To lease for profit any or all waters or other riparian rights held by the proposed Company, and any lands and premises therefor.

Before erecting any of the dams or waterways heretofore mentioned, a plan and description of the proposed dams, sluices or water ways shall be submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

Before undertaking any of the work heretofore mentioned in paragraphs three and four above stated, the said Company shall file one plan of their proposed work in the Office of the Registrar of Deeds of the County of Gloucester, one in the Office of the Secretary Treasurer of the County of Gloucester and one in the office of the Provincial Secretary. The Company shall give notice for four weeks in the Royal Gazette of the deposit of said plans, and thereupon the Lieutenant Governor in Council may approve of the said work, and after such approval, the said Company shall be empowered to proceed with the work.

To buy, acquire and hold bonds, stock and securities of other Companies.

To buy, sell, acquire, mortgage, lease, deal in and convey lands and premises of every description, and all rights, members, privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging and easements appertaining thereto.

The Company hereby incorporated shall be liable for the debts and obligations of the Nepisiguit Angling Association, existing at the time of the taking over of the said property, and may be sued for the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction, by the name of "The Nepisiguit Real Estate and Fishing Company, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Sixty thousand dollars divided into One hundred and twenty shares of Five hundred dollars each.
