

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC** Notice is hereby given that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of October, A. D. 1909, incorporating C. Miles Sherwood, Merchant; Maud J. Sherwood, Wife of the said C. Miles Sherwood; Leroy T. Lee, Clerk; Lena May Lee, Wife of the said LeRoy T. Lee; R. Jack Lee, Clerk; Henrietta C. Lee, Wife of the said R. Jack Lee; Carrie A. Simonson, Clerk; and Ida A. McDonald, Wife of William McDonald, Farmer; all of Centreville, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over as a going concern the business now carried on in the Parishes of Wilmot and Wicklow in the County of Carleton, by C. Miles Sherwood and all or any of the assets and liabilities of the said C. Miles Sherwood in connection with the said business, except the saw mill property of the said C. Miles Sherwood.

To establish and conduct a general department store, and to carry on a general wholesale and retail mercantile business.

To carry on all or any of the businesses of wholesale and retail dry-goods merchants, furriers, haberdashers, importers, dealers of and in textile fabrics, milliners, dress-makers, tailors, hatters, clothiers, furnishers, outfitters, gloves, boot and shoe dealers, dealers of and in leather goods, household furniture, carpets, rugs, furnishings, china and glassware, crockery and other household fittings and utensils, sporting goods, ornaments, bric-a-brac, jewellery, stationery, notions and fancy goods, books, musical instruments, meats, groceries, provisions, drugs, chemicals and other articles and commodities of personal and household use and consumption; and, generally of and in all manufactured goods, materials, provisions and produce.

To carry on a general wholesale and retail business in hardware of all kinds, paints and oils, farm tools and machinery, iron, stoves and furnaces, plumbers' supplies, painters' supplies, fertilizers, kitchen utensils, cattle and horse foods, doors and windows, and other house finish and wood-work, lime, brick, cement, coal, firewood, tin, and articles made of tin, bicycles and motor carriages.

To produce, purchase, sell and deal in butter, cheese, eggs, milk, vegetables, hay, oats, potatoes, poultry and other food, farm and dairy products, and the various materials entering into or used in the production thereof, and to carry on a general warehousing and cold storage business.

To buy, sell, manufacture, repair, alter and exchange, let or hire, export, and deal in all kinds of articles and things which may be required for the purposes of any of the said businesses, or commonly supplied or dealt in by persons engaged in such business, or which may seem capable of being profitably dealt with in connection with any of the said businesses.

To carry on the business of lumber dealers, and to acquire saw-mills and factories, lumber lands, and all other property which may be considered necessary in connection therewith, and to operate saw-mills and to operate and carry on wood-working factories and do a general wood-working business.

To build, maintain, acquire, lease and operate grist mills, flour mills, feed mills, and any other mills for the purpose of grinding or manufacturing farm products; and also starch factories; to purchase and sell grain and cereals of every kind and to manufacture, buy and sell flour and other food articles manufactured from grain or cereals.

To build, maintain, acquire, lease and operate carding mills and all kinds of mills for manufacturing cloth of every kind, to buy and sell wool and all constituent parts of cloth.

To construct, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire buildings, halls, theatres and rooms, for the purposes of public entertainments, theatres, concerts, operas, and all similar purposes, and to let or to hire said buildings, halls, theatres and rooms for said purposes, and to carry on the business of conducting concerts or theatres or plays, and to produce and present theatrical plays and operas.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

To carry on the business of electricians, mechanical engineers and manufacturers, and workers and dealers in electricity, motive power, heat and light, and any business in which the application of electricity or any power is or may be useful or convenient, or any other business of a like nature, and to manufacture and produce, trade and deal in any article belonging to such business, and all things used in connection therewith, or with any inventions or patents; to produce and accumulate electricity and supply the same for the production, transmission or use of power, for lighting, heating and motive purposes or otherwise, and to light streets, places and buildings by means of electricity or otherwise; to construct, maintain and operate works for the supply and distribution of electricity; to use, manufacture, operate and equip telephones, including all wires or appliances connecting electric apparatus, and including the formation of electric exchanges or centres, to purchase or otherwise acquire and to sell, work or otherwise deal with land, water, water power, water power supply and water power work and equipment or works; to make connections with or to amalgamate with other telephone companies; to undertake, construct, acquire and carry on works of all kinds relating to any business of the Company, and to enter into such contracts and make such arrangements as may be necessary to carry out the same; and generally to carry on the business of an electric light company and telephone company.

For the purpose in the last preceding paragraph set forth to enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground, or highways, in the County of Carleton and in the County of Victoria in the Province of New Brunswick, and to break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof, for the purposes and with the power of erecting and maintaining poles and posts, pipes or conduits, and string-

ing and maintaining wires for telephone or electric light purposes, and for renewing or repairing the same; the powers in this paragraph mentioned to be exercised subject to the consent in writing first being had and obtained of the Municipal Council of either county wherein such work and appliances may be placed under the authority of this Act; and further provided, that the said Company shall, at their own proper costs and charges and to the satisfaction of the Warden of such County and without unnecessary delay, repair and mend the said public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as aforesaid to the condition in which they were before the breaking up or opening the same. No poles or wires shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires of any telephone or electric light company now existing or so as to injure or impair the efficient working of any telephone or electric light system in operation in this Province in places where any such business may be in operation before the Company hereby incorporated establishes its system, it being understood however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the Company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles and stringing wires or laying the same under ground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles of any existing telephone or electric light system.

To subscribe for and take shares of stock in any other Company or Companies having objects in whole or in part similar to the objects of the proposed Company, and to pay for the said shares either in cash or by real or personal property or with shares in the proposed Company, and to acquire and undertake the business, assets and liabilities of any person, firm or company.

To lend money to any person or corporation doing business with the Company and to guarantee the performance of any contract or contracts made by any person or corporation doing business with the Company and other parties.

To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any of the real and personal property for cash, property, or for shares, debentures, or securities, of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the proposed Company.

To borrow money upon the credit of the Company, and to mortgage or pledge the real or personal property of the Company for the purposes of securing the repayment thereof; by the name of "C. M. Sherwood, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Ninety-nine thousand dollars divided into Nine thousand nine hundred shares of Ten dollars each, and with the head office of the said Company at Centreville, in the Parish of Wilmot, in the County of Carleton.

## NOTICE OF SHERIFF

**NOTICE** is hereby given, unto all to whom it doth or may concern: That there will be sold at Public Auction, at the Court House in the Parish of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester, on Monday, the seventh day of February next, A. D. 1910, at the hour of twelve of the clock, noon, all the estate, right, title and interest, both at law and in equity, of John J.
