

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for the grant of a charter of incorporation by Letters Patent under the Provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act" and Acts in amendment thereof.

1. The proposed name of the Company is to be "The Willett Fruit Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) For the purpose of purchasing, acquiring and taking over as a going concern the business and undertaking at present carried on by John G. Willett and W. Rupert Willett at the City of Saint John in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, under the name of J. G. Willett, with all the stock in trade, goods, chattels, property, assets and effects owned by the said W. Rupert Willett and John G. Willett in connection with the said business or forming part of the said business in any way, together with the good will of the said business and for carrying on and continuing the said business and for carrying on and conducting a general wholesale and retail fruit and produce business, and also for buying, selling and dealing in goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds generally.

(b) Also to purchase, build, erect or in any legal manner acquire, factory, plant and equipment, together with the necessary real and personal estate for the purpose of preserving fruits, canning fruits, distilling, manufacturing essential oils and the products of fruit.

(c) Also to purchase, lease, acquire, mortgage, have and hold real and personal property of all kinds, including bonds and stock of any incorporated company; and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

(d) And also to purchase, build, erect, or in any other legal manner acquire, operate and maintain potato, fruit, farm and garden produce, warehouses and depots and the necessary real and personal property for such purposes.

(e) And also to purchase, build, erect or in any other legal manner acquire cold storage plant or plants, together with all necessary real and personal property for such purposes, and to conduct a cold storage business.

(f) And also to purchase, sell and deal in all manner of real and personal property on a commission basis.

(3) The general place of business of the said company is to be established at the City of Saint John in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the Capital Stock of the proposed company is Forty thousand dollars, (\$40,000.)
