IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal, in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amendments, constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned and set forth:—

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Golden Fleece, Limited."
2. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:—

To carry on business as wholesale and retail merchants, dealers, traders, manufacturers and importers of clothing for ladies and gentlemen, haberdashery, silks, embroidery, laces, gloves, boots and shoes, hats, caps, furs and other articles of the same nature and relating in any manner to the same business.

To purchase and acquire the capital stock, stock in trade, real and personal property, plant, effects and assets of any other person or persons or bodies corporate now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business, with the good will of any such business, or to take security thereon, and to continue such business so acquired, or to sell and dispose of the same or of the assets thereof, and to pay for any such property or business so acquired by the issue of the proper amount of the paid-up capital stock of the Company.

To acquire, manufacture and operate all plant, machinery and appliances necessary and convenient for the proper carrying on of its undertakings.

To act as commission, consignment and general agents of other persons, firms and companies doing the same business, or any business similar to that of the proposed Company.

To acquire, hold, sell, mortgage and convey real estate for the purposes of the Company or in connection with its business.

To enter into any agreement for the sharing of the profits, union of interest, joint adventure and otherwise with any person or company carrying on business similar, in whole or in part, to that of the Company.

To acquire, hold, sell and convey all securities of any kind, real or personal, for debts and obligations due to the Company.
