UNDER and by virtue of the provisions of the Act of the Legislative Assembly, 9 Edward VII., Chapter 16, intitled "An Act to amend The Liquor License Act," Chapter 22, Consolidated Statutes, 1903," and of an Order in Council duly passed on this Thirtieth day of November, A.
