IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made under The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the Company proposed to be created, a body corporate and politic for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Carleton Mining Co., Limited."

The objects for which incorporation of the Company is sought are as follows:—

1. To purchase, take, lease, license, or otherwise acquire any mining licenses, mining leases, mining rights, and land in the County of Carleton or elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, and any interest therein, and to search, explore, work, exercise, develop, and turn to account the same; to quarry, smelt, refine, dress, amalgamate and prepare for market, ore, metal and mineral substances of all kinds, and to carry on any other operations which may seem conducive to any of the Company's objects; buy, sell, lease, manufacture and deal in minerals, plant, machinery, implements, conveniences, provisions and things capable of being used in connection with mining operations, or required by workmen and others employed by the Company; to construct, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend any roads, ways, tram-ways, bridges, reservoirs, water-courses, aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, mills, crushing works, hydraulic works, works, factories, warehouses and other works and conveniences which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to any of the objects of the Company, and to contribute to, subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any such operation.
2. To acquire, from time to time, any rights, licenses, leases, powers and privileges that any individual may acquire under the General Mining Act.
3. To carry on a general mercantile business in connection with its mining or other operations.
4. To subscribe for and take shares of stock in any other Company or Companies having objects in whole or in part similar to the objects of the proposed company and to pay for the said shares either in cash or by real or personal property or with shares of the proposed Company.
5. To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any of the real and personal property for cash or property, or for shares, debentures or securities of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the proposed Company.
6. To pay out of the funds of the proposed Company the costs of the organization of the same.
