

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC** Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Seventh day of July, A. D. 1909, incorporating Edward Goucher McColough, of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Harold Vesper Shaw, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Accountant; Edwin Joseph Malboeuf, of the City of Montreal, aforesaid, Accountant; Rupert Robert Roberts, of the City of Montreal aforesaid, Accountant; and Frances E. McColough, of the City of Saint John aforesaid, Married Woman; for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over as a going concern the business now carried on in the City of Saint John by E. G. McColough as dealer in boots and shoes, and all the property, stock in trade, good will, agency rights and other assets and to carry on and continue the said business.

To carry on the business of boot and shoe makers and dealers, and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in boots, shoes, leather and leather goods of all kinds, rubbers, blacking, varnish and other preparations for boots and shoes or leathers, lasts, laces or fastenings, over-gaiters, leggings and other accessories.

To acquire the good will, undertaking, rights, property and assets, and to undertake the whole or any part of the liabilities and engagements of any person or firm carrying on a business similar to the business which the company is empowered to carry on, and to pay for the same in cash, stock, bonds, debentures or other securities of this company or otherwise.

To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing of profits or union of interests with any person or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on, or engage in any business or transaction which the company is authorized to carry on or engage in, and to make advances to guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist any such person or company, and to take or otherwise acquire shares and securities of any such company, and to sell, hold or otherwise deal with the same; the whole subject to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act."

To take or otherwise acquire shares in any other company having objects similar to those of the company.

To take over, acquire, hold, use, sell, lease, exchange, convey and mortgage such real or personal property and movables, machinery, trade marks, patents, licenses and other franchises or rights thereunder as may be deemed necessary or expedient for the purposes for which the company is incorporated.

To lend and advance money or give credit to such persons, firms and companies as do business with the company and upon such terms as may seem expedient, and in particular to customers having dealings with the Company, and to give guarantees or become security for any such persons, firms or companies.

To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the company or any part thereof, for such consideration as the company may see fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects similar to those of the company, subject always to the laws of the Province of New Brunswick.

To do all or any of the above things as agents, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others, and to do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above mentioned objects.

The company hereby incorporated shall be liable for the debts and obligations of the said E. G. McColough, existing at the time of taking over the said property, and may be sued for the same in any court of competent jurisdiction, by the name of "E. G. McColough, Limited," with its head office at the City of Saint John, and a total Capital Stock of Twenty thousand dollars divided into Two hundred shares of One hundred dollars each.

The Capital Stock to be divided into two classes, namely: "A" stock, being ordinary stock and to consist of One hundred shares of \$100 each; and "B" stock, being preferred stock, and to consist of One hundred shares of \$100 each; and that such preference stock shall have preference and priority over the ordinary stock in the distribution of the assets; and shall also have preference and priority over the ordinary stock as respects dividends to the extent that all the said preference stock shall be entitled to receive each year a dividend of six per cent. before any dividend upon the ordinary stock shall be payable; such right to dividends on the ordinary stock to be accumulative, and in case there is any deficiency to pay said dividend on the preference stock in any one year, such deficiency shall be made up and paid before any dividends shall be declared on the ordinary stock in any subsequent year; it being understood that no greater dividend shall be paid on the preference stock over and above six per cent. aforesaid, in any one year, but in case of the distribution of the assets for any reason whatever, the holders of the preference stock shall receive payment in full to them of the amount of preference stock held by them respectively at the rate of \$100 per share before any amount shall be distributed to the holders of ordinary stock. And it is further intended that the holders of the preference shares of stock shall have the same right to vote and act at all meetings of the stockholders as the holders of the ordinary stock.

To start, acquire, print, publish, conduct and circulate or otherwise deal with any newspaper or newspapers or other publications and generally to carry on the business of newspaper proprietors and general publishers in the County of Northumberland. To carry on if and when it shall seem desirable the trade or business of general printers, lithographers, engravers, advertising agents, advertising contractors and designers of advertisement in all their branches; to carry on the business of publishers of books and prints, sellers and binders, and all things incidental thereto.

For the purposes of this business to build, construct, erect, publish, hire or otherwise acquire or provide real estate, offices, workshops, plants and machinery, or other things necessary or useful for the purposes of carrying on the objects of the Company.
