

IN THE MATTER OF "THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT."

NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made by the persons hereinafter named under the said Act to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick of a Charter constituting the applicants and others who may become shareholders in the company proposed to be created a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned.

The proposed name of the company is "A. E. Wry, Limited."

The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are the manufacture of all kinds of harness, boots and shoes and other leather goods and to buy, purchase, deal in, sell and dispose of any and all material necessary to the manufacture of said harness, boots and shoes and other leather goods.

To purchase, lease, hold and sell, mortgage, hypothecate and otherwise dispose of real and personal property incident to the carrying on of said business.

To use, develop and produce, steam, water, electricity or other power, force or energy capable of being developed as a motive power or otherwise.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold, use and enjoy both real and personal property, franchises, rights and privileges held and enjoyed by any individual or company carrying on business in this Province, similar in whole or in part to that which the said Company may be authorized to carry on.

To pay for such properties, rights, franchises or things as above set out, either in shares of the Company, or part in shares or otherwise, with full power to lease, sub-let, dispose of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer and dispose of personal property of all kinds, and to lease, mortgage, sell and transfer and dispose of and otherwise deal with the whole or any part of the property, (real or personal), powers, privileges, and franchises of the Company to any other Company or person, and to accept as consideration therefor, any shares, stocks, debentures or securities of any other company and generally to do all things necessary or expedient for carrying out the objects of the said Company or any of them, or incidental thereto, subject, however, to the laws of the Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase and acquire the stock in trade, real and personal property, plants, effects and assets of any person or persons, or bodies corporate now or hereafter carrying on any manufacturing or mercantile business with the good-will of any such business, or to take security thereon and continue such business so acquired or to sell and dispose of the same or the assets thereof.

To acquire by original application, purchase or otherwise any trade marks, formulae, trade processes, trade names and descriptive marks in connection with the business of the Company.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise and to hold, own, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or encumber shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other interests in or obligations of any other incorporated company or body corporate or corporation authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, or other obligations with the power while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon—as principal or for any other person or persons or corporations as commission merchants, broker, manager, agent, factor or warehouseman, or in any other capacity for him to buy, sell, store, warehouse, exchange, import, export, prepare for market, or otherwise handle, trade or deal in or with leather, harness, boots and shoes and any other goods or merchandise.
