

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Seventh day of April, A. D. 1909, incorporating Edward N. Emery, Stonecutter; John F. McLaughlin, Stonecutter; Frederick Fawcett, Stonecutter; Annie Pauline Emery, Married Woman; Robert Maxwell, Mason and Builder; and William J. Mahoney, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:—

To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over the business of wholesale and retail dealers in monumental and building stone and all the other lines of business now carried on by Edward N. Emery and John F. McLaughlin, under the name and style of Emery & McLaughlin, at the City of Saint John, and all the property, stock in trade, good will, book debts and other assets of the said business, and to pay for the same in paid-up stock of the said Company.

To conduct and carry on the general wholesale and retail stone business in all its branches, and to do all the things incident to such general wholesale and retail business.

To manufacture and sell all the products of stone.

To contract for the erection of any part and all parts of any building or construction in brick, stone, wood and cement, to contract for excavation and other works incidental to the carrying on of a general contracting business.

To manufacture and sell cement blocks, sills, lintels, steps, and any other article necessary for building purposes.

To own and operate quarries of freestone, marble and granite, to acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise quarries of marble, freestone and granite and to operate the same.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to own and hold real and personal property as may be deemed necessary for the above carrying on of the business of the Company, and the same to sell, mortgage, lease, let, hire, pledge or otherwise encumber or part with including herein power to sell, lease or encumber the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof or any interest therein.

As principal or for any other person or persons, firms or corporations as commission merchant, broker, manager, agent, factor or warehouseman, or in any other capacity for hire to buy, sell, store, warehouse, exchange, import, export, prepare for market or otherwise handle, trade or deal in or with cement, lime, wood, coal, freestone, marble, granite and any other goods or merchandise.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise, and to hold, own, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or encumber shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other interest in or obligation of any other incorporated body, corporate or corporation authorized to issue shares, stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations with the power while the holder thereof, to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership including the right to vote thereon.

To acquire by original application, purchase or otherwise any trade mark, formulae, trade process, trade names and description marks in connection with the business of the Company.

To open agencies, employ agents, erect buildings and carry on branch stores for the manufacture of and sale of any of the products of the said Company in whatsoever centres are deemed advisable.

The Company hereby incorporated shall be liable for the debts and obligations of the said Emery & McLaughlin, existing at the time of the taking over of the said property, and may be sued for the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction, by the name of "Emery, McLaughlin Company, Limited," with its head office at the City of Saint John, and with a Capital Stock of Fifteen thousand dollars divided into Three hundred shares of Fifty dollars each.
