Teacher's Pension Act.

Any person who shall have reached the full age of 60 years if a male, or of 55 years if a female, and who has been a teacher in the public schools of the Province for a period of not less than 35 years and who has retired from the service, shall, upon making application to the Board of Education, be entitled for the remainder of his or her life, to an annual pension equal to one-half of the average total salary of such teacher during the last five years before retiring, but in no case shall such pension be more than four hundred dollars.

BILL.

An Act to further Amend "The Schools Act."

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Assembly, as follows:—

1. Section 46 of Chapter 50 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, "The Schools Act," is hereby amended by striking out the words "Third Saturday in June" in the second line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "second Monday in July."

2. Section 52 of said Chapter 50 is hereby repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"52. All school meetings, except as hereinafter provided, shall be held at ten o'clock in the forenoon and may be continued until four in the afternoon of the same day, and may be adjourned to the next day at ten o'clock and continued as aforesaid, but no further adjournment shall take place."

On application in writing by the Trustees of any School District, made at least one month before the date of any school meeting, the Inspector may, in his discretion grant permission to hold such meetings at half-past seven in the evening instead of at ten o'clock in the morning of the same day, and such meeting, if held in the evening, may be continued until midnight of that day and may be adjourned until half-past seven o'clock of the evening of the next day, and continued until after midnight of that day after which no further adjournment shall take place.

The permission granted by the Inspector to hold evening meetings shall be in writing and shall continue in force until withdrawn by him on giving one month's notice in writing to the Trustees.

3. Section 84 of said Chapter 50 is hereby amended by striking out the words "Two Weeks" in the first line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "six days."

4. Sub-section (1) of Section 89 of said Chapter 50 is hereby repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof: "(1) One Superior School may be established in each County for every 6000 inhabitants and a majority fraction thereof."
